

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Severe Tropical Storm "Crising" as of 20 July 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 July 2025, at 5:00 PM, "Crising" maintains its strength while moving away from the Philippine Landmass.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory No. 17 issued at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Southwest Monsoon.

Severe Winds

- The Southwest Monsoon will bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):
 - Today: Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, Bicol Region, MIMAROPA, Visayas, Nueva Ecija, Nueva Vizcaya, Isabela, Benguet, Abra, Zamboanga del Norte, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental, Misamis Occidental, Lanao del Norte, Surigao del Norte, and Dinagat Islands.
 - Tomorrow (20 July): Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Cagayan Valley, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Visayas, and Zamboanga del Norte.
 - Monday (21 July): Metro Manila, Ilocos Region, Cordillera Administrative Region, Central Luzon, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, and Visayas.

Coastal Inundation

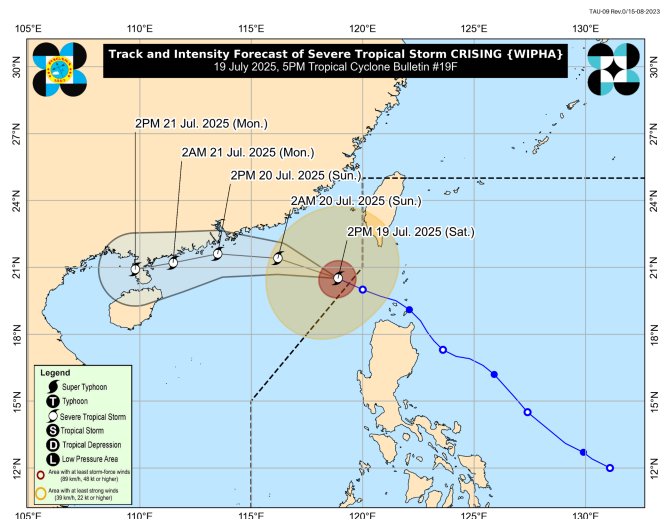
- Threats for storm surge to affect Philippine coastal areas have ceased. However, wind driven waves may still affect low-lying coastal communities.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

A Gale Warning is hoisted over the northern seaboard of Northern Luzon. Refer to Gale Warning No. 5 issued at 5 PM today for the details.

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to very rough seas over the following coastal waters:



- Up to 4.5 m: The seaboards of Batanes; the western seaboards of Babuyan Islands; the northern seaboard of Ilocos Norte
- Sea travel is risky for all types or tonnage of vessels. All mariners must remain in port or, if underway, seek shelter or safe harbor as soon as possible until winds and waves subside.

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 4.0 m: The remaining seaboards of Batanes and Babuyan Islands
- Up to 3.5 m: The remaining seaboards of Ilocos Norte; the seaboard of Zambales; the western seaboards of Bataan, Cavite, Batangas, Palawan, Occidental Mindoro, and Antique; the southern seaboard of Iloilo; the western and southern seaboards of Guimaras and Negros Occidental
- Up to 3.0 m: The remaining seaboard of Cagayan; the seaboard of Isabela; the remaining seaboards of Palawan
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.

Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The northeastern seaboards of Aurora and Northern Samar; the northern and eastern seaboards of Catanduanes; the eastern seaboards of Eastern Samar; the western and southern seaboards of Negros Oriental; the northern and western seaboards of Masbate; the southern seaboards of Quezon, Marinduque, and Oriental Mindoro; the seaboard of Romblon; the eastern and southern seaboards of Davao Oriental
- Up to 2.0 m: The remaining seaboards of Aurora; the northern and eastern seaboards of Polillo Islands; the northern seaboards of Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Lanao del Norte, Misamis Oriental, and Agusan del Norte; the eastern seaboards of Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, and Dinagat Islands; the southern seaboards of Siquijor, Cebu, Southern Leyte, Davao Occidental, and Sarangani; the northern and western seaboards of Zamboanga Peninsula, Basilan, Sulu, and Tawi-Tawi; the seaboards of Misamis Occidental
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK

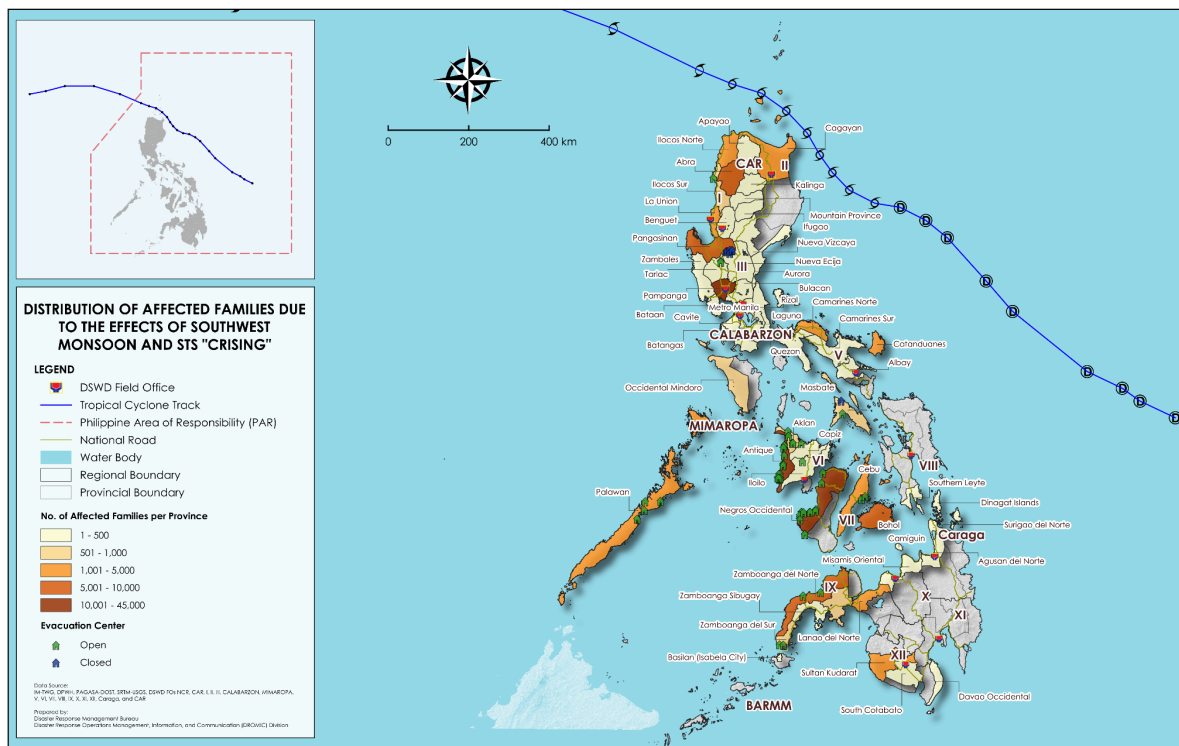
- “Crising” is forecast to move generally west northwestward over the next 24 hours before turning westward to west southwestward towards southern China for the rest of the forecast period.
- “Crising” is forecast to continue to intensify and may reach Typhoon category prior to close approach to Hong Kong.

The center of Tropical Storm “Crising” was estimated based on all available data 345 km West of Itbayat, Batanes (outside PAR) (20.8°N, 118.5°E) while moving West Northwestward at 20 km/h with a maximum sustained winds of 100 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 125 km/h.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **151,012 families** or **523,686 persons** are affected in **1,134 barangays** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga** and **CAR** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **9,621 families** or **33,608 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **407 evacuation centers** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, Caraga** and **CAR** (see Annex B). For the Sex & Age Distribution of IDPs (see Annex C) and Sectoral Distribution of IDPs (see Annex D).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **22,511 families** or **99,834 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **32,132 families** or **133,442 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VII, VIII, IX, X, XII, Caraga** and **CAR** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **487 houses** were damaged; of which, **130** are **totally damaged** and **357** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XII, Caraga** and **CAR** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱38,376,833.62** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱37,428,230.60** from **DSWD**; **₱943,292.14** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, and **₱5,310.88** from **Other Partners** (See Annex H).
