

DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Effects of Weather Disturbances in Davao Region

as of 12 July 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, the Department of Science and Technology–Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) weather advisory indicated partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to localized thunderstorms. These conditions had the potential to cause flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in some areas of the country, including Davao Region.

On 13 June 2025 at around 3:00 AM, several barangays in Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental experienced flash floods and landslides due to intense rains brought by localized thunderstorms. On the same day, a flooding occurred in the Municipality of Malalag, Davao del Sur due to intense rains brought by localized thunderstorms. Furthermore, the Municipality of Jose Abad Santos in Davao Occidental experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous intense rainfall.

On 15 June 2025 at around 7:30 PM, another flooding occurred in Brgy. Sainz, City of Mati, Davao Oriental due to heavy rainfall caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ).

On 17 June 2025, the Municipalities of Kapalong, Santo Tomas and Talaingod, and Kapalong in Davao del Norte and Malita in Davao Occidental experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall caused by Easterlies.

On 21 June, several barangays in San Isidro, Davao Oriental experienced flooding due to heavy rains brought by the ITCZ.

On 23 June 2025, several barangays in Braulio E. Dujali in Davao del Norte, also experienced flooding due to cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

On 25 June 2025, several barangays in the municipality of Kiblawan in Davao del Sur experienced a landslide due to partly cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by localized thunderstorms.

The compounded effects of multiple overlapping and/or continuous effects of weather disturbances—including localized thunderstorms, the ICTZ, easterlies, and the Southwest Monsoon—have caused repeated incidents of flooding and landslides in various parts of Davao Region. These events have increased the vulnerability of affected communities and highlight the importance of sustained monitoring, early warning, and coordinated response efforts.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **9,423 families** or **40,360 persons** are affected in **47 barangays** in **Davao Region** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **174 families** or **664 persons** sought temporary shelter in **nine (9) evacuation centers** in **Davao Region** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **33 families** or **165 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **33 families** or **165 persons** still displaced in **Davao Region** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **38 houses** were damaged; of which, **20** are **totally damaged** and **18** are **partially damaged** in **Davao Region** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱5,463,520.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱5,434,710.00 from DSWD and ₱28,810.00 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).

- 721,081 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 354,330 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 366,751 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 115,748 FFPs available at DSWD FO XI.
- ₱177.32 million worth of other FNIs available at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XI warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

24 June 2025	 DSWD FO XI facilitated the distribution of FFPs to the affected families in Sto. Tomas, Davao del Norte.
20 June 2025	 The LGU of Davao del Norte through its Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) provided FFPs to the affected families and persons.
17 June 2025	 DSWD FO XI facilitated the distribution of FNIs to the affected families in the Municipalities of Jose Abad Santos and Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental.
16 June 2025	 The LGU of Jose Abad Santos, Davao Occidental through its Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) provided FFPs to the affected families and persons.
15 June 2025	 The LGU of Santa Maria, Davao del Norte provided hot meals to the displaced families and persons.
