

# DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. 105, Tondo, Manila City

as of 08 August 2025, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 06 August 2025 at approximately 9:47 AM, a fire broke out at Aroma Compound, Happy Land, Road 10, Brgy. 105, Tondo, Manila. The fire was declared out at around 4:21 PM, resulting in the displacement of several families and individuals.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office in the National Capital Region (FO NCR), immediately coordinated with the Manila City Local Government Unit (LGU) to assess the situation on the ground.

Pursuant to the directive of DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian to uphold the welfare and dignity of disaster-affected Filipinos, the DSWD, through FO NCR and with support from the Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB), promptly extended relief assistance to address the immediate needs of the affected population.

FO NCR continues to closely monitor the situation and remains in active coordination with local authorities for updates and any requests for augmentation. Additionally, early recovery assistance is being facilitated to help accelerate the return of normalcy for the affected families.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **900 families** or **3,600 persons** are affected in **Brgy. 105**, **Tondo**, **Manila City** (see Annex A).

# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### **Inside Evacuation Center**

There are **900 families** or **3,600 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Brgy. 105, Tondo, Manila City** (see Annex B).

# IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **900 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. 105, Tondo, Manila City** (see Annex C).

#### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱997,620.00 worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).
